A standardized dress code is an important part of our school's identity and safety and positive school climate. Our school staff will also support students in upholding the SDC requirements. For students who are not in compliance with the SDC, a progressive discipline approach will be taken which may include but is not limited to verbal reminders of expectations, calling home for appropriate dress,

communication with parents/guardians and/or written communication with parents/guardians.

Safe & Caring School Community

SMM IS A CHARACTER SCHOOL: Each morning, as part of our announcements, we remind all students that our school is a character school. This means we always hold ourselves to a higher standard. If students should ever find themselves in difficulty and cannot resolve a problem on their own, they are reminded to approach a caring staff member or school administration for assistance. We review daily that we must always keep our hands and feet to ourselves and use kind words, even when we are provoked. Both the YCDSB and our school places excellence, equity, community and positive relationships at the heart of student success and well-being. Thank you for reinforcing this message at home; we value our partnership.

Expected Behaviour:

It is the expectation of the YCDSB and St. Margaret Mary Catholic School that students will:

- ★ Demonstrate honesty and integrity
- ★ Respect differences in people, their ideas and their opinions
- ★ Treat one another with dignity and respect, especially when there is disagreement
- ★ Respect and treat others fairly
- ★ Respect the rights of others
- ★ Take appropriate measures to help those in need
- ★ Seek assistance from teachers to resolve conflict peacefully
- ★ Demonstrate respect for people in positions of responsibility
- ★ Respect the need of others to work in an environment that is conducive to learning and teaching
- ★ Be courteous and polite at all times

We thank you for reviewing these expectations for behaviour and overall conduct with your child.



EMERGENCY & FOI FORMS: Emergency and Freedom of Information (FOI) forms were sent home with each child on the first day of school. Please ensure the information on the emergency form

is correct. If there are changes to be made, kindly make them right on the form. The FOI form asks for explicit consent by way of having parents authorize specific statements. Please sign, date, and return these forms to the school as soon as possible.

TECHNOLOGY CONSENTS: You will have received consent forms for student use of internet platforms such as Google and D2L (Design to Learn). Additional forms regarding appropriate use of online platforms and good digital citizenship have been included for primary, junior and intermediate students. Kindly

review these forms with your child, sign and date them, and return them to your child's classroom teacher.

VISITING SMM: All visitors to SMM must buzz the office from the front doors. Our office staff will ask you to identify yourself and state the reason for your visit. Please assist us with our safety procedures by being patient and answering the office staff's questions. Please do not ask students to open the front doors for you. If you are picking up your child from school, we will call them down to the main entrance for you. If you are dropping off a lunch, please leave it at the front entrance table (kindly label the lunch with the stickers and markers provided). Anyone who is required to enter the building must sign in to the main office and obtain a visitor's badge. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

TRANSPORTATION: For students riding the bus to school, please ensure that you have checked <u>School</u> <u>Bus City</u> for your pick up and drop off times and location. Students riding the bus will adhere to bus safety routines and procedures. Parents of JK to Grade 6 students are reminded that a parent/guardian is required to be at the bus stop to meet their child each evening.



SAFE ARRIVAL: Parents and guardians must communicate all lates and absences. This can be done by using the Safe Arrival number or website on the front page of this newsletter. Once *O Canada* and Prayers have begun, students will be

marked as late. Students arriving late at the front doors will wait until *O Canada* and Prayers have concluded before entering the building. A staff member will be at the front doors to let students into the building. Where practical and possible, student appointments should be scheduled outside the regular school day hours so as to maximize student learning.

EXTENDED ABSENCES: Extended absences must be communicated to your child's teacher and the office. In the case of an extended absence, a program of study will be prepared for the student. Cumulative student absences have an impact on student learning and achievement. For this reason, we strongly encourage parents/guardians to book vacations during scheduled breaks times (i.e., Christmas, March Break) where possible. If you have any questions or concerns, please speak with your child's teacher.



PARENTS/GUARDIANS ON THE PLAYGROUND: We respectfully remind our community that parents and guardians are not permitted on the playground

during morning entry routines. Students in Ms. Magni and Ms. Butrico's class will enter directly from the kindergarten pen. Parents of SK/1 to Gr. 8 students may drop off children at the school's front walkway and students will walk to the supervised yard. <u>Morning supervision begins at 8:05 am.</u> Parents/Guardians are welcome to pick up their children from the playground at 3:10 pm dismissal.

SAFETY AWARENESS WEEK: The YCDSB has a primary responsibility and goal to ensure a safe learning environment for all students and staff. As part of our safety initiative, SMM, along with other schools in the YCDSB, practice a variety of safety drills and

protocols. We will review and practice a variety of emergency drills and procedures in the event of an emergency situation such as Shelter in Place (extreme weather), Lockdown (an intruder in the school) and Evacuation (fire, gas leak, etc.). Schools are required to complete the above drills on an annual basis. More information is to follow.



ANAPHYLAXIS & ALLERGIES: The YCDSB has an anaphylactic policy to help protect students affected by life threatening allergies. As outlined in the policy, parents are asked to inform the school of such allergies and are

required to fill in S15 and S15a forms (available in the office). Each form must include a passport sized photo so that the student is easily identifiable to staff. Parents are asked to ensure that students for whom Epi-Pens are prescribed have two EpiPens at school. It is strongly advised that one Epi-Pen is kept on the student's person at all times and the other stored in the office for emergency use. It is important to note that we are a Nut-Safe School. Please monitor your children's snacks and lunches to ensure they contain only nut-free products. We continue to remind and inform our students NOT to share food in our school environment (including on the school grounds, buses, field trips, before/after school and in any school sanctioned events for students). We also respectfully ask parents not to send food items to school for students to share (for example, during birthday celebrations). 'Allergy Safe' environment signs are posted throughout the school, as well as outside classes where students with life threatening allergies are located. S15 and S15a forms will be reviewed by staff. Staff have also received training and information on signs of an anaphylactic reaction and how to administer the Epi-Pen.

SMM - **SCENT/FRAGRANCE FREE:** SMM is a Fragrance/Scent Free school environment. We kindly ask that you continue to closely monitor potential fragrances around the school environment; any type of fragrance may lead to a severe allergic reaction. Thank you for your continued collaboration as we strive to keep all children and staff safe.



ASTHMA PROTECTION: The YCDSB recognizes that there are some students who have a diagnosis of asthma that could be life threatening. Asthma management is a shared responsibility among students, parents, caregivers, and the school community. It is the

responsibility of parent(s)/guardian(s) to advise the school immediately upon registration and/or when in receipt of a diagnosis of asthma. It is also the responsibility of parent(s)/guardian(s) to ensure that all medical information pertinent to their child's diagnosis of asthma is current. If your child has a diagnosis of asthma, please contact the school office immediately so that the appropriate forms can be completed.



MEDICATION AT SCHOOL: Medications should be administered at home. However, should your child require medication to be administered at school, please pick up the required S16 and S16a forms from the office. Complete the form (including

physician's signature) and return it to school. Students are not to keep medication (aside from inhalers and EpiPens) in their knapsack or in the classroom.

PEDICULOSIS: YCDSB recognizes and appreciates concerns related to Pediculosis. The Board also recognizes that the Ministry of Health does not designate Pediculosis as a communicable disease, and as such, it is not considered a health hazard to the community. Anyone can get head lice, regardless of cleanliness. Head lice is not a public hazard, as it does not cause illness, but they are a nuisance. Please check your child's head regularly for lice or nits. If you do find lice or nits, contact the school office. Students will be readmitted to school once treatment has been administered and confirmed by the parent, in accordance with the procedures of this policy.

CELL PHONE USE: Students are not permitted to use their cell phones (text or call) at any time while at school, unless directed by their teachers. Parents and students will communicate using the school phone. Please contact the school if you require a message to get to your



child. If a student is feeling unwell, parents/ guardians will be notified by school staff. For students who are not in compliance with this expectation, a progressive discipline approach will be taken. We thank our parent partners for reviewing this safety expectation with their children. If you have questions or concerns, please contact our main office.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES: School Board Policy 311 Digital Discipleship states that all personal electronic devices, such as cell phones, carried by elementary students shall be kept out of sight, turned off and not used during the school day, unless authorized by the principal or under the direction of a teacher. Failure to abide by this policy may result in confiscation of the electronic device. As you know, these items not only can disrupt the learning environment, but are also expensive and hard to replace. At times, they also cause conflict among students and can pose a risk to one's reasonable expectation of privacy. It is strongly recommended that these items remain at home. Please assist us by reviewing and supporting this policy with your child.

PARKING LOT SAFETY Safety is our collective responsibility!

Everyone must feel safe and welcome at SMM, and that begins in our school's parking lot.

Parents, guardians and students are also encouraged to use active travel methods to come to school. Walking, jogging, or bike riding to school are great ways to get daily exercise. Many studies have linked student success and well-being to daily exercise and movement.

Those driving are asked to be extra cautious around the school's ground for those walking, biking, etc. Be careful when backing out of parking spots. Those walking are encouraged to make use of walkways for optimal safety

The emergency lane and bus route are exclusively for emergency vehicles and buses; vehicles are not permitted to drive into this area.

Accessible parking spots are available and are designated for those who have licensed permission. This is the law. Please do not park in these spaces, even temporarily, unless you have a permit.

If your child must be driven to school, you are expected to follow these Kiss and Ride guidelines:

- Drive into the 'Kiss and Ride' lane along the curb before allowing your child to get out of the vehicle;
- Students must independently exit from the passenger side of the car (closest to the school); parents are to remain in the vehicle
- Student belongings (i.e., school bags) should be with the child for easy exit/access

COMMUNICATION WITH STAFF: Our staff are here to support our students and families. Should you have any questions or concerns, please discuss them with your child's teacher by calling the school office or sending an email to make an appointment.

Elementary Safe Arrival Absence Reporting

At York Catholic District School Board, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely to school every day. Parents and guardians are required to report their child(ren)'s absence or late arrival in advance, or before bell time for the current day by accessing the **Elementary Safe Arrival Program** using any of the three methods below:

- Toll Free Safe Arrival Phone Number 1-855-856-7862
- The Safe Arrival SchoolMessenger website: go.schoolmessenger.ca
- The *SchoolMessenger* App Store or the *Google Play Store*.

The first time you use the App or Website, select **Sign Up** to create your account. To report an absence, select **Attendance** followed by **Report an Absence**.

These options are available **24 hours a day**, **7 days a week**. Future absences can be reported at any time. This Safe Arrival reporting procedure is in place for York Catholic Elementary schools. If you have children at a York Catholic secondary school, please follow that school's absence reporting procedures.

Parents and guardians who have not reported their child(ren) absent or late will receive an automated phone call where they can explain the absence. If our system is unable to reach a designated contact after the required amount of time, office staff will follow up.

If any of your contact information changes, or if you have any questions about the **Elementary Safe Arrival Program**, please contact your child's school office. Thank you for your attention to this important information about reporting of your child's attendance for the upcoming school year.
